Note on Contributors

- **Dawid Hopensztand** (1904–1943) teorist of literature and critic. His works touch upon the domain bordering literary history, ideology, and stylistics. His studies were the first Polish attempts of sociologically oriented typology of genre forms.
- Stanisław Jaworski historian of literature, Professor at the Jagellonian University, Cracow. The author of many works on the Polish literary avant-garde of the interwar period.
- Janusz Kryszak Professor at the Mikołaj Kopernik University, Toruń. Historian of the 20th-cent. literature.
- Zdzisław Łapiński Doctor in the Institute of Literary Studies. His interests focus mainly on Norwid, Gombrowicz, and Miłosz.
- Stefan Morawski Professor in the Institute of Art's History and Theory of Polish Academy of Sciences. The chief editor of Polish Art Studies. The author of many books concerning the character and the transformations of the aesthetic ideas, Polish and European from the 18th cent. till our days. I.a. he published in English and Spanish Inquires into the Fundamentals of Aesthetics. His two recent works (in Polish) pertain to the problems of the crisis of art and the crisis of aesthetics.
- Janusz Sławiński Professor of the Institute of Literary Studies of Polish Academy of Sciences. Theorist of literature and literary critic. His chief domain of research are the problems bearing on historical and linguistic poetics as well as on sociology of literature. Many his essays deal with the methodological questions and seminal issues of description, analysis and interpretation of literary works.
